First Annual Awards Breakfast Florida Gold Coast Clean Cities Coalition

Hollywood, Florida - The Florida Gold Coast Clean Cities Coalition (GCCCC) hosted its first Annual Awards Breakfast on Friday, January 21 at the South Florida Regional Planning Council office, recognizing the efforts of its members in the promotion and use of alternative vehicle technologies and alternative fuels. The event was co-sponsored by AmeriGas Propane and featured an alternative fuel vehicle display by Trans Tech Energy. A bi-fuel police Dodge Charger and Ford Transit Connect were on hand for attendees to drive and experience.

The 2011 Awards honored members and stakeholders who have made outstanding contributions to the Coalition's goal of reducing America's dependence on imported oil and improving the environment by creating a sustainable alternative fuel market. Awards were presented in five categories to exceptional Coalition members:

- The Leadership Award was presented to Gold Coast Clean Cities Coalition Chair, Patricia Asseff for her dedication and enthusiasm in reaching the goals of the Coalition. For over eight years, City of Hollywood Commissioner Asseff has led the Coalition's efforts to protect the Region's environment and reduce Southeast Florida's dependence on foreign fuels.
- The Champion for Alternative Fuel Vehicles and Alternative Fuels Award was presented to Miami-Dade County for its use of alternative fuel vehicles in its fleets including, 457 hybrid electric vehicles, 38 hybrid transit buses, and six hybrid hydraulic diesel waste collection vehicles.

These efforts have reduced carbon dioxide emissions by 3,500 tons over the past two years.

- Maribel Feliciano, Chair of the Gold Coast Clean Cities Education and Outreach Committee, received the Community Involvement Award for her exemplary commitment to education and outreach in South Florida. Ms. Feliciano developed educational programs, outreach events, and informational materials that supported the Coalition's goals, reaching over 7,600 people.
- The Alternative Fuel Station Award was presented to Wise Gas, Inc. for its great effort to provide an alternative fuel option in South Florida. The company owns and operates the first public access Compressed Natural Gas (CNG) facility in the State of Florida.
- Choice Environmental Services, Inc. received the Alternative Fuel Fleet Award. The refuse company is the first in South Florida to convert a portion of its operations to CNG fuel. It operates a fleet of clean-burning natural gas refuse trucks that reduce harmful emissions by over 25% compared to diesel-fueled trucks.
